TO: Retirees and Beneficiaries of the Nova Scotia Teachers' Pension Plan (TPP)

Re: Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) Notification - CPI -1%

Effective July 1, 2022, a 3.8 per cent Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) will be added to your monthly pension benefit from the Teachers' Pension Plan. An increase in your pension benefit is granted when the increase in Canada's Average Consumer Price Index (CPI) is greater than 1 per cent.

The increase in the average CPI for the 12 months ending April 30, 2022 was 4.8 per cent. Your TPP Cost-of-Living Adjustment amount was calculated as follows:

Increase in the average CPI	4.8%
Minus 1.0 % as prescribed by the formula	-1.0%
Cost of Living Adjustment	3.8%

What is the Consumer Price Index?

Indexing for a particular year is calculated based on the average of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Canada (All Items), as published by Statistics Canada, for the 12 months ending April 30 of the preceding school year. CPI is the most commonly used measure of inflation.

The CPI is made up of eight major classes that include:

- 1. Food
- 2. Shelter

- 5. Transportation
- 3. Household operations and furnishings
- 4. Clothing and footwear

7. Recreation, education and reading

6. Health and personal care

8. Alcoholic beverages and tobacco products

Goods and services are organized by Statistics Canada according to a classification system. Products are grouped with other items because they have a common end use or because they are substitutes for each other.
